Eligibility

Who is Eligible?

- Student who meet basic eligibility criteria for federal financial aid and who have the financial need can be considered for these funds. Financial Aid Office will determine your eligibility based on the information provided on your 2019-2020 FAFSA. If you are eligible to file a FAFSA but have not yet filed for 2019-2020 and need assistance, please file a FAFSA at fafsa.ed.gov. Funds are limited and will be awarded in the order qualifying applications are received.
- Title IV Eligibility included eligible immigration status, High School graduated or equivalent, valid social security number, registration with selective service, etc. (Section 484 of the HEA)
- Students in default are not eligible
- Students with an overpayment are not eligible
- Unfortunately, the U.S. department of Education does not allow these funds to be used for international students, undocumented students or online students. Students must not have been enrolled in only online classes prior to the emergency action on March 13, 2020. Student must be enrolled in at least one non-online course.
- Each student is required to complete the Emergency Grant Relief Form identifying the category of need before the funds will be disbursed.
